

The Gospel is the unlimited gift of grace, joy, forgiveness, and power. Let everyone who is thirsty come! Let anyone who wants the water of life take it as a gift! (Revelation 22:17, ISV).

Christmas is the Gospel story; God's gift of Jesus to us. In reference to this greatest gift of all, there is a word that repeats again and again; 130 times in the New Testament. It begins and ends each of the apostle Paul's letters. It turned the western world upside down during the Reformation. It is *grace*.

The Greek word translated 'grace' is charis. It comes from a root word meaning 'to be joyful'. It is a term for the active love of God that streams continually from God as light streams from the sun. It is the essence of the Gospel.

Augustine said that it is not grace unless it is free, for it carries the meaning of generous gifts. When interpreted theologically, it signifies redemption, and all that goes with redemption. Grace is a word set in contrast to law, works and human merit. We read: ...if by grace, then it is no longer by works; if it were, grace would be longer be grace (Romans 11:6, NIV).

A Wildfire of Grace

Grace shows us that God is seeking sinners to bless them and change them, and to fill their lives with fruitfulness, innocence and joy. This is because God is what he says he is: Love.

God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son...not...to condemn the world, but to save the world through him (John 3:16-17, NIV). That is Grace. That is the Gospel.

There could have been no grace for us but for the fact that God the Son, in Eden, volunteered to take our place and redeem us. "Grace...came through Jesus Christ" (John 1:17, NIV).

If the Gospel were something trite, such as "Be good and God will save you", it would barely have made it out of Jerusalem. But instead, the Gospel is the unlimited gift of grace; it is forgiveness, and joy, and power, and fruitfulness, and mercy, and a thousand other good things. This is the reason the Gospel spread 'like wildfire' in the first centuries after Christ. It's the reason people wanted to live for it and were prepared to die for it.

We need to tell the world, and remind ourselves, that grace is God's unimaginable generosity. It led God to give us Christ, God's "gift that is too wonderful for words!" (2 Corinthians 9:15, CEV). It led God to promise to supply as we need it "exceeding abundantly above all we ask or think" (Ephesians 3:20, KJV).

God's promise is a promise of grace. This is the free, abundant gift of the Gospel.

THE GOSPEL IS NOT A BUTTERFLY...OR IS IT?

God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God (2 Corinthians 5:21, NIV).

When I was about eight years old, I saw a film that showed how caterpillars turned into butterflies. I was really impressed by the stunning change. The film featured this Bible verse: "If anyone is in Christ, that person is part of the new creation. The old things have gone away, and look new things have arrived!" (2 Corinthians 5:17, CEB). I thought that was awesome.

But as the years went by, I found that verse more and more discouraging. Why? Because even though I considered myself to be a believer in Jesus, I didn't feel like a new creature; in fact, I felt like the grub. I was still myself, with the same personality, still sinning. So, where was the bonus of being a Christian? What was the Gospel really all about?

I knew that the only way I could get into the kingdom of Jesus was to have a clean record. And the Bible told me that the only way to have a clean record was if God didn't count my sins against me. The only way.

You can enjoy a vibrant life of faith right now.

The good news is that the Bible tells us exactly how it is that God doesn't count our sins against us: because "God caused the one who didn't know sin to be sin for our sake so that through him we could become the righteousness of God" (2 Corinthians 5:21, NIV). That is how the kingdom of God has come to this world. The result is that your status is changed: you "become the righteousness of God" in Christ.

The Gift of a New Life

We are now in a right standing with God, and God is able to pour out his Spirit, with gifts of love, joy, and peace. It's a whole new life. It's like being born again: born into the Kingdom of Christ. The Good News of the Gospel is that you are a new person because of the free gift of Christ's righteousness.

When you are part of the Kingdom of Christ, you get citizen rights. And when Jesus walks with you in life, things really do change. You become an ambassador of Christ, the agent of reconciliation in this world. That's what the Gospel is about.

My problem was that I was looking at the grub and wondering where the butterfly was. Now, the supreme love of God, through the sacrifice of Jesus, has changed everything. It's the Gospel that tranforms you into that "beautiful butterfly".

In a remote village in southern India stands an ordinary hut. It is lonely, with no power or water, and with no outward sign that there might be anything precious within. A small boy, just five years old, slept inside, curled up on the dirt. His name was Ranjith. When he awoke, his grandmother scraped together a small portion of leftover food. It was a meagre meal of fish, rat and snake, caught by Ranjith's father the day before. With a tummy still rumbling, Ranjith, whose mother died when he was a baby, wandered off to find some amusement.

Today, he heard a different sound above the din of the street. Joyful music danced in the air, drawing Ranjith into the heart of the village. He saw a man speaking to the crowd. He could smell food. Ranjith's tummy began to growl again. He edged closer.

'Hello, I'm Pastor Joseph,' smiled the man. 'Are you hungry?'

Ranjith sat amongst the children, eating a warm meal and listening to a story about a man named Jesus. He liked the story. Jesus sounded kind. There were more stories about Jesus. Ranjith listened, eyes wide. Never in his five years had he heard of anyone like Jesus. He was so excited that he dragged his grandmother and father along to hear the things Pastor Joseph was saying. The family of three accepted Jesus as their Saviour.

Through Pastor Joseph, your generosity to GNU's ministry is providing food for Ranjith's family, and teaching them more about Jesus. Life is still challenging, but now they have hope. 'I live with a smile because of Jesus,' says Ranjith. 'Jesus has made me happy.'

So said John as he gave his inspiring testimony at his baptism recently. Like many Ugandans, John had a religious upbringing, but there seemed little that was compelling in church life, so he stopped attending. His mother's strong relationship with God was inspiring, but still he could not bring himself to make a personal commitment.

"Two years ago, I began receiving devotionals from GNU in my email. I also began making prayer requests via their website. Later, I met their representative, who continued encouraging me in my journey of knowing more about God. I loved the teachings, but unfortunately GNU has no church here.

"I knew I needed to join a church group for fellowship and support, so my sister and I tried a place called Well of

Worship. It was led by Pastor Isaiah, a friend of Pastor Bonifresh of GNU. Right from my first visit, it felt like home.

"The only thing that was missing was my full commitment, and when the opportunity came up to be baptised, I knew instantly that was what I wanted. Now I want to study, and I'm fully committed to God to live the amazing life he has planned for me."

But that very night she accepted Jesus as her Lord and Saviour. Ranjith's father did the same at a subsequent meeting. Every week, Ranjith receives a small amount of food to help him survive. Despite the little they have, Ranjith is overjoyed to know that there are people like you who care, and a Saviour who loves them and has given them hope.

We love Jesus, and he makes me happy.
